Questions and Answers

I have not attended two Leadership Development Programs this semester. Can I use ATLAS week events?

You can use only one Atlas Week towards your leadership requirement.

Can I attend more than one ATLAS Week event?

Although one ATLAS week event can be allowable for your two leadership requirements, you can attend as many ATLAS Week events as you would like. To find out about the Atlas Week events, please go to <http://atlas.slu.edu/index.html>.

I participated in non-MLK, Jr. Leadership Development Programs. Can I still count it as one of my activities?

Yes. You may count your participation in other SLU Leadership Development programs as one of your activities, even if you are participating in the event. Examples include those sponsored by Service Leadership, African American Studies, TRIO, iLEAD, etc.

I'm just planning to attend a lecture or performance. Do I have to participate in any way?

Feel free to attend an event and to learn from the information provided. The goal is for you to develop a more global understanding of the world and how your role as a world citizen can positively impact the lives of others.

Okay, so if I pick something you don't agree with, but I liked and enjoyed it, then that's okay?

I encourage you to find an event that will benefit you personally and not just fulfill a requirement. However, please keep in mind that we would prefer that the program or organization that you are participating in fulfill your requirements to be affiliated with SLU.

Can I count an event that I have to attend for a class?

Yes.

Does attending the Billiken World Festival count toward my requirements? That sounds too easy.

It does count, and it is easy. Go. Pick up information. Talk with someone different from yourself. Carry a flag for the Parade of Nations. Eat something. Dance. Join a new student organization. Don't just walk through it on your way to class. You will be asked to verify your attendance at the event on the reflection form.

No. Philanthropy is not included. Your service should reflect an activity made you to improve the lives of others.

If you were a part of an organization that worked to raise money for a good cause, will permit this to count as community service?

Yes, although we'd prefer to know that our students committed their time and efforts in the community interacting with the constituents who will benefit from their hard work.

I hosted two students for MLK, Jr. Scholarship Interview Weekend. Can I count this as two events?

No. This weekend counts as one leadership activity. However, exceptions are made on a case-by-case basis.

Does hosting a student and sit on the panel discussion count as two events?

Yes, even though it was the same program.

Are MLK scholars automatically placed in the MLK section of SLU 101?

Yes, you are in a reserved section. However, this is just until the advisor sets you up in one of the three MLK U101 sections. All MLK scholars are required to attend the MLK U101, unless there are Athletes, Physical Therapy or Business students.

It will be held on Sunday, August 26, 2007, at 1:00 pm in the College Church Ballroom. You will be mailed a formal invitation to your permanent address in July.
